DEAR GUARDSMEN: Let's face it: regardless of reasons, it seems to take longer these days for the mail to get through.

We've just installed and are starting to phase into our operation, some fancy new addressing machinery, re-cutting all of our address stencils in preparation for making a complete change-over in about six months.

While we're about it, and in the interest of expediting magazine delivery, we're anxious to incorporate postal zone numbers in all addresses—you know, where it says "Zilchville 6, Caltucky": the "6" is the postal zone.

If you live in a "zoned" city but don't include zone in the address you give us, our girls are going to have to stop what they're doing, thumb through the appropriate one of 106 different booklets, look up your street, find the zone, and enter it on your address stencil. Multiply that operation thousands of times, and we've lost a lot of girl-hours.

So, if you live in a "zoned" city, ask your mailman or your postmaster, what's your zone, and include it in your address to us—and on all of your mail. It will help us, all of your correspondents, and the Post Office, to get the mail through faster.
