

Features

The Kansas Army Guard's 127th Field Artillery is the first National Guard unit to receive the M109A6 Paladin. This is the Army's latest self-propelled howitzer. In addition to the United Defense Paladin, the Kansas Guard's 130th Field Artillery is fielding Loral's Multiple Launch Rocket System (MLRS). Gaining these two modernized weapon systems in Kansas marks the creation of the Army National Guard's first heavy artillery brigade.

When the Air Force retired its last RF-4 Phantom, a void was left in the Air Force's tactical reconnaissance ability. The 192d Fighter Wing, Virginia Air National Guard, was tasked with filling that void while maintaining its primary air superiority mission. In an extremely short time the 192d was able to test, become mission capable and deploy to Italy with the Air Force's new manned tactical reconnaissance pod. The 192d is now the only multi-role tactical reconnaissance unit in the Air Force.

If you can't see the forest for the trees, your effectiveness as a commander, especially a combat service support (CSS) commander, will be severely restricted. The Army Guard teaches a course on multifunctional logistics, at the Guard's Professional Education Center, designed to help CSS officers see the "big" picture. Graduates of the strenuous course are multifunctional experts in the Functional Area 90 (FA90).
