# 20 A Conversation with Lt. Gen. H. Steven Blum

As someone who began his military career in the Special Forces, Lt. Gen. H. Steven Blum likes to hit the ground running. And that's exactly what he did when took over as National Guard Bureau chief in April. After only a month on the job, he announced the most comprehensive changes the National Guard has seen in decades. Blum sat down with NATIONAL GUARD magazine last month to discuss his plans and vision.

This month we celebrate the 50th anniversary of the end of fighting in the Korean War. The conflict is one of the most ignored in history; however, it serves as one of the great dividing lines in modern Guard history. Force structure, missions, training and racial composition were dramatically altered by this first hot conflict of the Cold War. The result is a Guard that bears little resemblance to its pre-1950s predecessor.
