The Adjutants General Association of the United States (AGAUS) held its mid-winter meeting January 31-February 3, 1998, on the heels of the president's proposed fiscal year 1999 Defense budget that shortfalls the Army National Guard \$693 million. The budget was just one issue the adjutants general addressed. They passed 31 resolutions pertaining to personnel, procurement, force structure, bonuses, operations and maintenance, modernization, training and military construction issues in both the Army and Air Guards.
