# 49th Division Headquarters Going to Bosnia........ 28

For the first time since the Korean War, an Army Guard division commander will lead active Army troops when the 49th Division Headquarters deploys to Bosnia in 2000. Army Chief of Staff GEN Dennis J. Reimer announced his decision to send the "Lone Star" Division during a speech to the 120th General Conference. The 49th will command troops from 11 nations including elements of the U.S. Army's 3d Armored Cav.
