The first National Guardsmen to respond to the Sept. 11 attacks at Ground Zero weren't wearing BDUs, but uniforms of a different color. They were part-time Guardsmen who are full-time New York policemen, firemen and security officers—people with two professions where life and limb can be the price of service. Four of them were killed that day. It's why to the New York Guard, the war on terrorism is so personal.
